Second Palestinian Killed in Settler Attack on Sinjil

AL-JAZEERA: A second Palestinian youth has died from wounds sustained in an armed settler raid on the town of Sinjil, north of Ramallah in the occupied West Bank. Earlier, the Health Ministry confirmed the death of Saif al-Din Musallat, who was severely beaten by settlers during the attack.

AXIOS: US Proposes Delaying Talks on Israeli Withdrawal from Gaza

AXIOS: A senior Israeli official told Axios that no progress has been made in the past 24 hours of ceasefire negotiations. Washington reportedly suggested postponing the issue of Israeli withdrawal until agreements are reached on a prisoner list and aid distribution. Israel continues to insist on a 2-3 km buffer zone in Rafah and 1-2 km along other border areas.

Gaza Water Authority: Diesel Supply Will Last One Week

AL-JAZEERA: A senior official told Al-Jazeera that Gaza's water production has dropped by 70% due to Israel blocking fuel access to water wells. No fuel has reached the wells since Israel's March offensive. Remaining supplies from UNOPS may last only one more week. The water supply to central Gaza is completely cut off, while Gaza City and Khan Yunis have seen drastic reductions.

Gaza Health Ministry: Fuel Shortage Threatens Hospital Collapse

GAA HEALTH MINISTRY: The Ministry of Health in Gaza warned that fuel depletion is forcing hospitals to shut down sections and putting patients' lives at risk. Authorities urged all institutions to act immediately to prevent a catastrophe and supply fuel for hospitals and ambulances.

Israeli Journalist Arrested for Opposing Gaza Genocide

REUTERS: 798 Palestinians waiting for aid in the Gaza Strip have been killed since late May, according to UN Human Rights Office statistics reported by Reuters. Of those killed, 615 were in the vicinity of Gaza Humanitarian Foundation sites, and 183 were on aid convoy routes.

Two Israeli Soldiers Wounded in Northern Gaza Clash

ISRAELI MEDIA: Israeli Army Radio reported that two soldiers were wounded in a clash in the northern Gaza Strip after an anti-tank missile was fired at a tank last night.

In a clear indication of escalating resistance operations against occupation forces, 39 soldiers and officers have been killed in the Gaza Strip – according to Yedioth Ahronoth newspaper – since Israel resumed the war on March 18th, after reneging on the January 2025 agreement.

This comes as Al Jazeera's correspondent confirmed that an Israeli airstrike targeted the Abu Rahma building on Omar al-Mukhtar Street, east of Gaza City.

HAARETZ: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu departed Washington after a five-day visit, during which he met twice with US President Donald Trump. Haaretz commented that Netanyahu left with no tangible progress on the Gaza file, receiving only vague promises and showcasing self-promotion over substance.

The document, prepared by the European External Action Service, also includes options for a full suspension or barring Israel from EU programs for students and researchers.

He also noted that the aircraft carrier USS Vinson will leave the Middle East in two days, while the USS Nimitz will remain.
